Since 2017, we have partnered, observed, and actively participated in the volunteerism industry to learn about the major challenges people face when they want to get involved in their local community. Our programs and technology products are delivered specifically to eradicate these barriers and to make volunteering fun, easy, and equitable.



Due to various life commitments, people cannot find routine times weekly and monthly to volunteer.

Nonprofits typically demand routine time commitments.



Volunteering is inherently a costly affair. Add membership fees, swag costs, and an obligation to donate, financial costs make volunteering inequitable.



Even with time and money, the lack of a central, user-friendly, ondemand platform to find opportunities in real time disempower people from volunteering.



There are not a lot of real-time incentives for people to volunteer, like a platform to track their individual social impact or share achievements.

A model for mobilization.

The foundation to the model of our operation is the belief that all people, irrespective of age, social status, beliefs, gender, race, and other demographics have some level of willingness and ability to volunteer. We believe that irrespective of the cause or issue, people fall into one of four categories of mobilization: (1) learner, (2) ally, (3) advocate, and (4) activist.



We raise awareness and hope about the power of volunteering in various communities and institutions through social media, workshops and speaking engagements worldwide.



We consult for public and private organizations to help them build their volunteer engagement processes while also creating impactful opportunities for people to get engaged in their local community.



We train young leaders with skills, knowledge, and expertise needed for them to become better advocates and activists in their local communities through our dedicated programs and volunteer trainings.



All mobilization starts with one person. Human beings, individually and together, are at the center of our model.



We join and actively participate in global networks dedicated to volunteer mobility and data collection in order to continuously learn and shape the future of volunteering, especially in a rapidly changing world.









Our flagship IVolunteerNow Ecosystem (comprising an app, enterprise software, and map) connects individuals to real-time volunteer opportunities in their local communities in Georgia, making the experience of volunteering fun, easy, and equitable.

We advocate for volunteer friendly policies locally and globally to continuously create a world where people can come together and volunteer for causes they care about, at will and on-demand.

Year in Review - 2021

Overview

Building on the impact and the successful launch of our new logo and branding in 2020, we had an intentional yet impactful year in 2021. We continued to deliver our flagship programs while ideating our IVolunteerNow ecosystem.

Platinum Seal

Consistently in the past couple of years, we have been able to promote transparency and achieve the Platinum Seal from Guidestar for reporting our work and impact.

Writers' Council Advocacy Program

Our Writers' Council program published 89 articles, spotlighting causes around the world and graduated 22 young leaders from the program in two cohorts this year.

Archived Programs

IVolunteerSeries Talkshow and the GroceryAid volunteer matching platform that was released during COVID were both archived after a successful, cause-specific impact.

UN Civil Society with DGC

We continued our advocacy at a global scale as a Civil Society Associated with the UN Department for Global Communications, attending various workshops and youth advocacy events.



Giving Voice to the Voiceless Grant

In 2021, we were awarded the "Giving Voice to the Voiceless" grant by the University of Georgia Grady College of Journalism in support of our activist training and empowerment program Writers Council.

Hilton Head Island Concourse Grant

One of our biggest and long-time supporters, the Hilton Head Island Concourse D'Elegance provided us another grant this year to support the design and development of our IVolunteerNow app and ecosystem.

Future We Want Model U.N.

In 2021, we continued our partnership with the Future We Want Model United Nations and connected volunteers from around the world to this program. Young leaders came together to New York City and the U.N. HQ to discuss the world's most pressing issues in a simulated UN.

Inaugural Community Engagement Exchange

We partnered with the International Research and Exchange Board (IREX) to support the inaugural Community Engagement Exchange program. We were selected as one of the nonprofit organizations to host a youth leader and attended the orientation in Detroit, Michigan. CEE is a bold new civil society initiative, created by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Education and Cultural Affairs, that equips young community leaders with the expertise, resources, and skills to support resilient communities around the world and sustain a global civil society ecosystem.

Overview

2022 was dedicated to learning and insight. We continued our internal programs and services and spent most of our resources and time laying the foundation for 2023 and beyond. Internally, we started developing the key goals for our IVolunteerNow app launch, onboarded a new board of directors, and discussed the future of the organization. Due to various reasons, this year was used to invest internally.

3 Year Action Plan

Due to changing circumstances and the year-over-year growth of the organization, the staff met to plan the next three years and the impact we hope to instill through our programs.

Writers' Council Program

In 2022, we hosted two cohorts of the Writers' Council and published 47 articles covering a wide range of causes that are important locally and nationally. 16 young leaders were part of these two cohorts.

Future We Want Model U.N.

Strengthening our long partnership, we supported the Future We Want Model United Nations in New York City this year as the official volunteer providers. We recruited and trained 20 volunteers to support this event.

The "silent" phase ended in 2022. The planning and goal setting kicked into gear in 2023. We re-visited some of our internal assets and updated them. We published a new donations page that made contributing to our organization a seamless process. Hilton Head Island Concours Grant




U.N. Civil Society Advocacy

Looking into the future.

Moving forward into 2024 and beyond, we will prioritize four key elements. First, the launch and expansion of IVolunteerNow app and enterprise software. Second, building a model of financial sustainability. Third, transitioning to a full-time staff. Fourth, laying the foundation for organizational key performance indicators grounded in the sustainable development goals.

The next pivotal step for IVolunteer International is the launch and expansion of our ecosystem: IVolunteerNow, IVolunteerGo, and IVolunteerMap. These platforms are designed to synergize and enhance volunteer mobility in Georgia and beyond. The integration of these platforms will create a seamless user experience, making it easier for volunteers to find and participate in meaningful projects. Notably, IVolunteerGo is earmarked to generate revenue through a subscription model. This revenue stream is critical as it will fund further development, marketing efforts, and operational costs, propelling the organization towards longterm stability and growth.

To ensure our continued success, we will build a robust model of financial sustainability. This involves creating a comprehensive donor engagement and appreciation pipeline. Additionally, we will focus on creating valuable grant and investment opportunities for private sector partners. Prioritizing both seasonal and long-term approaches to development will allow us to adapt to changing circumstances while maintaining steady growth.

One of the critical steps towards realizing our vision is the hiring of a full-time staff.

The presence of dedicated, full-time employees is essential for maintaining and advancing our technology solutions and other programs. The reliability and expertise of full-time professionals will foster a stable and productive working environment, enabling us to achieve our strategic goals and expand our impact. In essence, investing in human resources is paramount to sustaining the momentum of IVolunteer International and ensuring the success of our initiatives.

To measure our progress and impact effectively, we will establish key performance indicators (KPIs) for our programs and the entire organization. These KPIs will be grounded in the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), aligning our efforts with global standards for sustainable development. By systematically measuring our performance against the SDGs, we can ensure that our programs are making a meaningful difference in communities worldwide and staying true to our mission.
